HOLIDAY LAKE 4-H EDUCATIONAL CENTER OVERVIEW

Holiday Lake 4-H Educational Center is a year round educational facility offering programs for youth and adults. The Center is a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization located in the 20,000-acres Appomattox/Buckingham State Forest, the largest state forest in Virginia.

The Center's objectives are:

- To provide four seasons annually of educational camping programs for 4-Hers in Central, Southside and specialized camps across the state of Virginia.
- To provide special programs and activities to include Natural Resource Education as a resource for school groups, 4-H clubs, the summer 4-H camping program as well as for adults.
- To provide facilities, programs, and services necessary to serve as the Virginia 4-H Shooting Education Center.
- To provide quality facilities and support services year round for diverse groups from multiple geographical regions.

The 4-H Center serves as a 4-H Camp during the summer, providing an education in outdoor living for over 2,900 youth and adults. The Center serves the following 17 counties and 2 cities including; Albemarle, Amherst, Appomattox, Amelia, Brunswick, Buckingham, Campbell, Charlotte, Cumberland, Fluvanna, Greene, Louisa, Lunenburg, Mecklenburg, Nelson, Nottoway and Prince Edward counties and the cities of Charlottesville and Lynchburg for 4-H Summer Camping as well as other 4-H related programs throughout the year.

Other year round programming focuses on natural resource/environmental education, outdoor adventure, shooting education, archery, youth leadership development as well as a variety of workshops and events. Year round camps and workshops include: Natural Resource Education, Decoy Carving Workshop, Women's Outdoor Weekend, VA Hunter Skills, Fishing Camp, 4-H Shooting Education Camp, State 4-H Shoot, Family Camp, Swimming Classes, Forestry Camp, CSI Camp, Cloverbud Camp, Oil Painting Workshop, Challenge Courses, Christmas Camp, and Banjo/Mandolin Workshops.

A major part of the Center's programming efforts are directed toward Natural Resource Education which include both day and overnight trips for public, private and home schools as well as other groups for learning hands-on in the outdoors during the school year. These classes benefit almost 4,000 students annually. Students learn concepts and ideas taught in the classroom while also experiencing natural resources in the outdoors. Overnight trips offer the maximum learning experience. All programs correlate with Virginia's Standards of Learning (SOLs) and focus on natural science, life sciences, life-skill development and leadership development. Challenge course programs for groups are also offered. Both the low and high ropes in addition to a climbing tower are designed to bring participants together in a new environment where they share a common experience while learning to work together.

Today, at the Holiday Lake 4-H Educational Center, over 10,000 participants benefit annually from a variety of programs. Holiday Lake 4-H Educational Center has served the youth and adults of Central/Southside Virginia and beyond since 1941. For 80 years, tens of thousands of lives have been enriched through hundreds of educational programs, friendships and a closeness to nature.
