## RIFLE KIT

- Lancaster County Pennsylvania Germanic style. This style was used extensively on the early frontier from Pennsylvania down through Virginia and into North Carolina.
- The wood for these rifles is special ordered ,upgraded from the standard or fancy grade to Extra Fancy grade.
- Component sets have a wooden patchbox kit included.
- Rifles have a single trigger.
- The furniture (butt plate ,pipes and trigger guard) is brass.
- The locks are Chambers deluxe flintlock.
- The barrels are by Rice barrel company.
- .50 Caliber with 42 inch tapered & flared barrels
- .54 caliber with 44 inch tapered & flared barrel.
