

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS


Questions can be discussed with children under 3rd grade, and older children can develop answers to respond. These are built to spark conversations.

- Froggy loves books! What types of books does he plan to check out at the library?
- Why does Froggy say that Storytime is for babies?
- Do you think Froggy changes his mind about Storytime by the end of the book?
- Why do you think Ms. Otterbottom allows Froggy to be loud during Storytime? Is it like this at your library?



ACTIVITY 1 - Frog Life Cycle

Frogs like Froggy and his family are **amphibians**, animals that have a spine (backbone) and that need water, or a moist environment, to survive. They hatch from **eggs** and become **tadpoles**. Next they cycle through becoming a **tadpole with legs** and a **froglet** and finally become an **adult frog**. Label the image below using the words in bold.





ACTIVITY 2 - Stuffie Leapfrog

Leapfrog is a game that has been around for a very long time. To play, one or more of your friends squats down and you jump over them! Once you get to the end of the line of people, you then squat down and let someone jump over you!



For today, line up as many stuffed animals, upside down bowls, or other things that you can. You can do this down a hallway, across a room, or even all the way around your house! Start in one spot and see if you can jump over each stuffie or other item that without stopping. Can you turn around and keep going?
